What is hospice care?

Hospice brings comfort, safety and quality of life to the end of life's journey. It focuses on the person—who they are, how they feel and what they need—with comprehensive care to meet their physical, psychological, social, cultural and spiritual needs. Ultimately, hospice is not about dying. It's about helping people live as well and as comfortably as they can in the place they call home when life expectancy is limited.

Hospice care supports the entire family

Hospice care eases the stress on caregivers and supports the patient's family following the end of their loved one's life. Our bereavement team stays in close contact with the family for 13 months after their loved one's passing to help them through their journey.



We meet you where you are

Compassus provides services where our patients call home:

- House or apartment.
- Friend or relative's home.
- Assisted living facility.
- Nursing home.

If hospitalization is medically necessary, our services may still be available.

Who should receive hospice care?

- People with advanced illness with a life expectancy of six months or less.
- Patients and families who opt for symptom management, rather than curative treatment.
- Patients and families who choose no extreme measures to sustain life.

Symptoms and signs

It may be time for hospice care if you or a loved one experience:

- Deteriorating mental abilities.
- Inability to perform daily tasks.
- Frequent hospitalizations or ER visits.
- Rapid health decline (in the past 6 months).
- Family and medical teams unable to provide care.
- Physical symptoms (e.g., reduced appetite, significant weight loss).
- Increasing illness signs (e.g., pain, shortness of breath, nausea, infections).

Talk to your doctor if you think hospice may be right for you or your loved one.
